Staff News:

A warm welcome to Jodie and Katey who joined the Inters and Pre-School Teams over the past couple of months. Jodie joins us following working in a reception class and Katey has a background in childminding and is currently beginning her NVQ in Childcare, along with Ally in Inters and Lauren in Pre-School.



While your child is at Parklands Day Nursery they will have an electronic learning journey called Learning Book which uses a secure hand held tablet to collect Wow Moments - a photograph or video which may include a little text but will not be linked to any learning outcomes. The photo/video may be a moment when your child is particularly engaged with an activity, learning something specific or simply showing them happy and content. There will be no limit on these but as a guide you should receive one each week. We believe this will give you an insight into your child's day and allow the practitioners to spend quality time interacting with the children and shaping their experiences. We urge you to upload photos of your child's Wow Moments from home as this will help the key worker to see your child's individual interests and consider what additional experiences they may like. It is worth mentioning that every photo/video needs to be uploaded from the main nursery office and checked for suitability before uploading onto Learning Book. Although we (management) do this on a weekly basis, when we are working within the base rooms there may be a delay in you receiving the photos/videos.

Look out for the information boards at the room entrances which will give you details on the week's menu, book of the week and planned group activities. Planned activities will continue to originate from the children's interests, next developmental steps, your input and whatever is going on around them in the world at the time. You will also see a "Next Week" sheet which will outline specific events or activities and ways in which you can be engaged, along with your child. Practitioners will be encouraging you to be involved in activity planning as much as possible to give you a connection with your child's experiences at nursery.



Reminders:

- Please drive very slowly within the nursery car park, particularly on entering the grounds. There have been a couple of near accidents recently.
- We are coming to the end of a very busy period at nursery and ask you to be patient with us if we are unable to respond to your emails as quickly as usual. Please ring to speak to us if your query is urgent.
- Please make sure that we have sun hats for the children on warmer days and apply sun cream prior to coming to nursery.
- The government's tax free childcare scheme you can get up to £500 every 3 months (up to £2,000 a year) for each of your children to help with the costs of childcare. Set up an online account for your child and for every £8 you pay into this account, the government will pay in £2 to use to pay your provider. Parklands are registered with this scheme and we encourage you to sign up if you have not done so already.

Please note that Parklands will be closed on the bank holiday of Monday 28th August.
